Housing Panel Highlights

Our first time hosting a panel went off without a hitch! We had Adrienne Solenberger and Esther Heckman from Opportunity Council, Gina Stark of Whatcom Housing Alliance, Irene Kohlman of Bellingham Housing Authority, and Lindsey Karas from Mercy Housing.

We asked about the process for getting housing or help with keeping housing; programs for migrant workers and undocumented residents, women, and families; COVID noeviction orders; and how healthcare workers can assist with housing issues, among many other questions. - Multiple access points for intake Opportunity Council Community Resource Center seemed a best first place to start the process, as they refer to a variety of programs (called Coordinated Entry), including:
 - > Eviction prevention
 - > Move-in deposit assistance
 - > Transitional housing
 - > Rapid re-housing (3-6 month rental assistance)
 - > the Housing Pool (wait list 350+ for single people or without children

 - Key Takeaways > More CARES funding (Congressional COVID bill) coming to Whatcom County to help with rental assistance
 - > COVID No-Eviction Order extended until Oct. 15
 - > There are different definitions of "homeless" and different eligibility criteria for different properties and housing programs
 - > Law Advocates and Opportunity Council can help resolve some landlord-tenant situations
 - > NW Justice Project provides free legal assistance/ advocacy and is a good resource for more complicated landlord-tenant situations
 - · Advice for people looking for housing and on a waiting list
 - > Pay any housing-related debts (even if it's not paid off completely, this shows responsibility for dealing with it).
 - > Keep your contact information up to date and check in with the agency/program/ landlord every 1-2 months
 - > If living with homelessness, keep documents that show this, and/or contact information for people who can vouch for you to confirm this (like case managers or social service providers).


